This year, with PE premium, Semley School has seen an increase in participation levels within sports clubs and a positive attitude towards sports and activity. We have been able to offer a range of after school clubs which offer opportunities for all age groups to become involved with and broaden their experience of sports and games. These clubs have been led by teachers and specialist coaches, consistently offering a high standard of teaching.

The sports coaching this year has been provided by Astrella Primary Stars coaching. The coaching has given all staff opportunities to gain more confidence in teaching a range of different PE skills at different levels. Teachers and support staff now feel they have greater levels of experience in a wider PE curriculum. We have continued to follow the updated long term plan and all classes have benefitted from opportunities to try new sports and activities. It has also given us a clearer view of the progression of skills throughout the school which in turn has supported teacher's understanding of where their children are and need to be next. This in turn has improved attitudes towards PE, increased enjoyment and the motivation to participate as teachers and sports coaches are able to set achievable but at the same time challenging targets.

We have been able to offer children in year 3 the opportunity to swim in the spring term on a weekly basis with a trained swimming coach where the transport cost has been covered by sports premium. The children's skills in swimming has improved immensely and they have all gained dramatically in water safety as they have progressed through the appropriate level of swimming lessons. The children have also benefitted from other external sporting activities such as fixtures with other schools; a football tournament; Kwik Cricket festival, with transport being covered by sports premium.

The children were inspired by a Paralympian that came to school and worked with each class on fun sporting activities with a focus on healthy lifestyles and achievements. This was funded by the PE premium and the children have since talked a lot about it and how they now practise the activities they learnt at home setting up competitions within their families.
