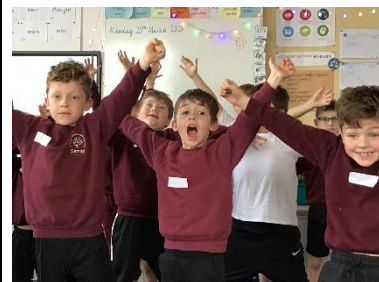
Class Round Ups
