Mrs C-C's Nights of Reading Challenge will be drawing to a close on Sunday 12th of July.

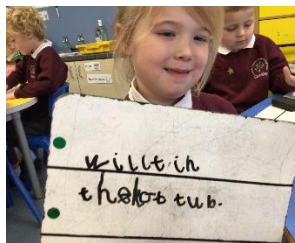
